

WHEN IS A PERMIT REQUIRED?

The following is a list of projects for which a PERMIT IS REQUIRED:

- √ Accessory building over 120 sq ft
- ✓ Accessory building under 120 sq ft with a concrete foundation
- ✓ Additions to a building
- ✓ Air conditioning or furnace installation or replacement
- ✓ Concrete installation larger than 4 ft x 6 ft
- ✓ Deck construction or replacement when more than thirty (30") inches above grade and larger than 25 sq ft
- ✓ Demolition of a building
- ✓ Driveway installation or replacement (including circular driveways)
- ✓ Driveway approach installation or replacement. Approach is the portion of the drive connecting to the street.
- ✓ Electrical work replacement of or installation a of panel. Replacing switches, plugs and ballasts are exempt.
- ✓ Fence construction, repair or replacement over 50%
- ✓ Irrigation systems lawn sprinklers Backflow Report Required
- ✓ All Patio Covers if attached to the residence, an engineer letter is required
- ✓ Plumbing work replacing fixtures only no permit is required
- ✓ Remodeling of a building requiring the addition or replacement of walls *Engineer Letter Required*
- Retaining wall construction or replacement over four feet in height -; Engineer Letter Required.
- √ Roof replacement whole roof decking and shingles; Shingles only does not require a permit.
- ✓ Solar Panel installation or replacement meter release required
- ✓ Swimming pool above ground construction less than 24 inches is exempt
- ✓ Swimming pool in-ground construction, repair or filling-in
- ✓ Water heaters replacing or adding
- ✓ Water softeners or filtration installation
- ✓ Water or sewer line replacement repair work such as exchange of washers and faucets is exempt

The following is a list of projects for which a PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED:

- ✓ Accessory building under 120 sq ft they must meet set back requirements (5' from side and rear property line)
- \checkmark Fixture replacement if there's existing wiring or plumbing
- ✓ Painting, papering, tiling, carpeting, cabinets, countertops, or similar finish work
- ✓ Portable heating equipment
- ✓ Portable ventilation equipment
- ✓ Retaining walls less than four (4') feet in height measured from the bottom of the footing to the top of the wall Wood decking not more than thirty (30") inches above grade or NOT supporting a vertical load The above two lists are NOT all-inclusive.

Failure to obtain a permit may result in double permit fees or a citation.
